Member Spotlight: Sandy River Farm

The Farm, owned by Bussie and Brenda York, along with their daughter and son in law, Trudy and Eric Johnson, has operated as a dairy farm in Farmington producing milk for over 60 years. They have cared for each newborn calf and have watched her take the place of her mother in the milking order throughout the years. In February, the farm received notice from their milk buyer of the last 18 years that they would no longer have a market for their milk. The reason was not a quality issue but rather a policy change that doesn't allow the farmer to sell any milk or milk product directly to their own community. The Sandy River Farm has sold their milk like this for years, however,

and has a real relationship with the locals. They have also invested in building a farm store several years ago so receiving this news was quite a shock.

It is possible that the recent takeover of the company by a huge foreign conglomerate had

to do with this decision. Loyalty to the small family farm is now less of a concern for they now source organic milk from a mega-farm in California at a few dollars less than from Maine farmers. The impact of these mega-farms (with 10,000 plus This change takes effect in herds) and the ability to deliver August and the farm will lose spells a real challenge.

by tank trucks in 36-40 hours the source that sustains them. There are some options that they are considering: send their family of cows on a final trip to the slaughterhouse which would be an emotional plight for their whole family or downsize the herd and sell locally. At present, they have a small processing facility which now makes skim, 1 ½%, 2%, or whole milk in various size containers, along with unprocessed raw milk at the farm 24/7. The farm also makes a unique old fashioned frozen custard ice cream, as well as yogurt, butter, etc. The big question is, would this be

enough? How much will the

local community get behind

them in this new endeavor?

They need community support to keep another farm from falling vacant.

The public's help is critical. Would bringing back a doorto-door delivery system be something that you could support? They will do their part by offering a great product, free from GMOs, antibiotics, and hormones. Their milk is not a blend of many farms onto one truck, it's from a single source so they know what goes into the product.


